## About The Guidance Center

Since 1958 The Guidance Center, based in Southgate, has been committed to its mission to: Nurture development. Foster resilience. Cultivate well-being.

Over the last 65 years the agency has maintained a collaborative relationship with its local communities and schools to support adults and children experiencing mental health difficulties and other challenges. A group of concerned residents and educators recognized the need for mental health services in our area and joined forces in 1958 to help form The Guidance Center. Since then we have worked as a team to respond to the needs of children, adults and families in southeast Michigan.

The agency operates a wide range of programs and services at 18 locations. Our expertise in mental health and wellness, early childhood education, intellectual &



developmental disabilities services and support, substance use disorders, Kids-TALK Children's Advocacy Center, Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic, and research and evaluation helps more than 16,000 members of our community annually work on their own personal triumphs in life.

## Message from the

## **President & CEO**

This past year was transformational for The Guidance Center. We emerged from the pandemic stronger, more resilient and with significant outcomes for the people we serve.

Last year we were invited to participate in the first year of Michigan's demonstration of Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics, an innovative new model of behavioral healthcare. This invitation was made possible based on years of preparation and work to meet the criteria to be a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC). For the first time since the Community Mental Health Act was signed into law in 1963 there are national standards, a sustainable payment model, and metrics that clinics must adhere to. CCBHC is truly a bipartisan effort at the national level and was conceived by Senators Debbie Stabenow (Michigan) and Roy Blount (Missouri). We completed year one of the demonstration and are grateful for the support and commitment of our federal, state and Detroit-Wayne Integrated Health Network funders who made this possible.

The current public mental health system primarily is focused serving persons with the most serious behavioral health conditions (danger to self or others) and persons with Medicaid. The CCBHC is transformative because it allows participating organizations to serve all persons who seek assistance with behavioral health problems regardless of the severity of the condition. It enables service to persons with or without any insurance coverage. The CCBHC model makes access to behavioral healthcare less complicated.

We made an unprecedented investment in our staff this past year and employ more than 550 persons across the organization working in more than 25 unique programs. The work we do to "Nurture development. Foster resilience. Cultivate well-being." is made possible by our dedicated employees. Staff, donors and the community of people we serve challenge us to be relevant and open to what is needed to be successful at home, at school, at work and in community life.

This report highlights the impact we make across southeastern Michigan and in the communities we serve. ## CCBHC paves new paths

In 2021, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services selected The Guidance Center as the only mental health and substance use service provider in Wayne County to participate in its Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) demonstration. CCBHCs provide a comprehensive array of services for people of all ages with mental health and substance use disorders, regardless of insurance coverage, their ability to pay, or the severity of their needs.

During this fiscal year, through our enhanced CCBHC funding, TGC added two new service locations with the Horizon Building in Taylor (playroom pictured at right) providing additional space for the Children's Outpatient and Infant & Early Childhood Mental Health programs, and the Superior Road building (also in Taylor) offering expanded Adult Behavioral Health services.



## MST team receives well-deserved recognition

The Multisystemic Therapy (MST) Team at The Guidance Center was nominated and chosen by our partner the Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network to receive the **Spotlight Certificate of Appreciation** in recognition of its hard work and dedication to the children, youth and families served in the System of Care. The MST program, under the umbrella of our Children & Youth Services, provides intensive in-home, family and community-centered, evidence-based clinical intervention for youth with severe behavioral concerns. ## New pharmacy moves into TGC's Southgate campus



In May our agency was thrilled to celebrate the ribbon cutting at the new **Genoa Healthcare** pharmacy on our Southgate campus. Guidance Center CEO Kari Walker and COO Laura Huot were joined by Mayor Joseph Kuspa of the City of Southgate, agency Board Vice Chair Kevin Fischer of NAMI Michigan, Genoa Director of Operations Heather Kauffman, and other guests for a brief welcome and overview of the extensive and comprehensive services Genoa offers to our clients and community.



Genoa's specialized pharmacy services include using pre-filled pill organizers to help people stay on their medications, proactive outreach calls, help with prior

authorizations and other hands-on pharmacy care. This approach to pharmacy care helps patients stay on their medications at a rate of more than 90%, compared to about 50% with a traditional approach. A study published in a peer-reviewed journal found that this type of integrated pharmacy also reduces emergency room visits and hospitalizations, which significantly reduces the total cost of care.

This new pharmacy can be found inside the entrance to Building 4 (Entrance 1) at 13101 Allen Road on our Southgate campus. We are pleased to welcome Genoa to better serve our clients and assist them with their mental healthcare needs.

Guests enjoyed free popcorn and pop at this community event and stayed for the special panel discussion after the film where local panelists shared their powerful testimonies of dealing with anxiety disorders and their optimism for the future. Afterwards the agency handed out tote bags with a number of SUDDs goodies to promote mental wellness and encourage discussion about mental health.







## Walking with NAMI to reduce stigma

On September 24 The Guidance Center was one of 88 teams participating in **NAMIWalks Your Way 2022**, sponsored by NAMI Michigan, on the campus of Wayne State University in Detroit to raise awareness and funding for mental health. The agency had nearly 40 participants including employees, family, friends and clients united in the fight against stigma and working toward suicide prevention.

TGC also participated in the **Out of the Darkness Walk** at Willow Metropark in New Boston, sponsored by the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention.

# Signature Events



Champions of Wayne, a program of The Guidance Center, transforms student obstacles into success through an incentive-based mentoring system to inspire every student to graduate in the best way possible.

Established in 2008, the program combines adult mentoring, academic and life goal setting, and achievement recognition that results in individualized prescriptions for success and financial rewards for students. Champions who successfully achieve their goals for a semester receive a \$200 incentive that is celebrated at the Student Achievement Banquet.







In February 2022 we gathered at a Student Achievement Banquet to recognize 86 of the 260 students enrolled in the Champions of Wayne program to highlight their successes—working with their mentors -to reach both their academic and life goals for the previous semester.





On June 24 2022 we celebrated another Student Achievement Banquet to honor the 97 students (working with 56 mentors) who have worked so hard through Champions of Wayne to excel at their academic pursuits!

In October Champions of Wayne held a kickoff event at Wayne Memorial High School to introduce incoming students to the program and encourage them to ask questions and learn more about how they could improve their grades and succeed with Champions of Wayne!






## Summer Glow Starry Night for Children







## Operating Revenue & Expenses










#### **Child and Adolescent Functioning**

#### **Children's Crisis Diversions VS Psychiatric Hospitalizations**










